Shirley McKinney is Superintendent for Manhattan Sites, which includes African Burial Ground National Monument, Federal Hall National Memorial, Castle Clinton National Monument, Theodore Roosevelt Birthplace National Historic Site, General Grant National Memorial, Governors Island National Monument, Stonewall National Monument and Hamilton Grange National Memorial in the borough of Manhattan and Saint Paul's Church National Historic Site, located in Mount Vernon, New York.

Ms. McKinney is a 37-year National Park Service veteran who joined the system in 1980 as a clerk-stenographer at Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore. She received several promotions before moving to Mount Rushmore National Memorial in 1986 as the administrative officer, a post she held until she transferred to Gateway in 1988 as a program analyst. She went on to become Gateway's Administrative Officer and then Superintendent of its Staten Island unit.

Ms. McKinney moved on to work as the assistant to the Commissioner of the National Parks of New York Harbor, a collaboration of 10 national parks, including Manhattan Sites, in the New York City metropolitan area and was promoted to Deputy Superintendent at Manhattan Sites. From there she was promoted to her current position as Superintendent.
